

## Digital Literacy WebPage

### Your GOAL:

- Create a visually interesting webpage that includes the passage given to you and all of the information the passage contains.
- Consider the layout and design of the page and the structural elements from the passage. These should be reflective in your actual webpage design.

### Tools:

- There are several webpage designers out there. The one that I use most is [www.weebly.com](http://www.weebly.com). You don't have to use this one, but it is an option. If there's another one you're more familiar with, feel free to use it. You may use templates provided on the page, but you can design the page to appropriately represent your passage.

### Passage:

- Read the passage and make sure that you understand it, inside and out. Ask yourself:
  - What is the main idea of the passage?
  - What is the purpose of the passage?
  - How does the author feel about this subject?
  - Who is the audience of the passage?
  - What types of images or colors are visually appealing to this audience?
  - What information is the most important and should be highlighted?
  - What images can I find online to help support this passage?
  - Are there any hyperlinks that might be needed to be added to enhance the information or story of the passage?

### Creativity:

- Be as creative as you can, but make sure that the final product of your page, adequately represents all aspects of the passage; the main ideas, the purpose, the tone, the audience, the main facts or supporting evidence, the images from the passage, the information provided, etc...

You will be graded on your ability to meet all of the above requirements. **This assignment is worth 140 points** (the equivalent to a weeks worth of Reading Plus points!)
